

## 2024 CMPS Primary Sample (PS) Topline Report November 24, 2025

This report produces weighted column percentages for the adult Primary Sample (PS). Read each group category from top-to-bottom.

A total of 15,210 completed interviews were collected online in a respondent self-administered format from May 15 to September 4, 2025, for the adult PS. The survey was implemented in 11 languages: English, Spanish, Chinese (simplified), Chinese (traditional), Korean, Vietnamese, Tagalog, Arabic, Urdu, Farsi, and Haitian Creole at the discretion of the respondent.

Participants were randomly selected to participate in the study via sample sources with an established record of providing reliable and demographically accurate samples of the CMPS target populations.

The margin of error for the full primary sample with an N=15,210 is +/-0.8%. The primary Asian sample is N=3,697, and carries of margin of error of +/-1.6%. The primary Black sample is N=4,989 and carries a margin of error of +/-1.4%. The primary Latino sample is N=4,094 and carries a margin of error of +/-1.6%. The primary White sample is N=2,117 and caries a margin of error of +/-2.1%.

The data are weighted within each racial group to fall within the margin of error of the adult population in the 2023 ACS U.S. Census American Community Survey (ACS) 1-year data file for age, gender, education, income, state, nativity, and ancestry.

- \* This report compares only the primary sample groups: Asian, Black, Latino, and White. Results for the oversample segments, which include Afro-Latino, Black Immigrant, Jewish, LGBTQ, MENA, Native American, and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, are reported in a separate document.
