

2024 CMPS California Sample (CS) Topline Report November 24, 2025

This report produces weighted column percentages for the adult primary sample in California, which includes Asian, Black, Latino and White respondents. Read each group category from top-to-bottom.

A total of 19,634 completed interviews were collected online in a respondent self-administered format from May 15 to October 6, 2025, for the entire CMPS adult sample. This includes 3,295 cases in the four designated California primary adult sample segments. The survey was implemented in 11 languages: English, Spanish, Chinese (simplified), Chinese (traditional), Korean, Vietnamese, Tagalog, Arabic, Urdu, Farsi, and Haitian Creole at the discretion of the respondent.

Participants were randomly selected to participate in the study via sample sources with an established record of providing reliable and demographically accurate samples of the CMPS target populations.

The California Asian sample is N=1,121, and carries of margin of error of +/-2.9%. The California Black sample is N=850 and carries a margin of error of +/-2.7%. The California Latino sample is N=1,000 and carries a margin of error of +/-3.1%. The California White sample is N=324 and has a margin of error of +/-5.4%.

The data are weighted within each racial group to fall within the margin of error of the adult population in the 2023 ACS U.S. Census American Community Survey (ACS) 1-year data file for age, gender, education, income, state, nativity, and ancestry.

* This report provides results only for the California adult primary sample, which includes Asian, Black, Latino, and White respondents in California. The Main Sample segments (national Asian, Black, Latino, and White) and hard-to-reach segments (national Afro-Latino,

Black immigrant, Jewish, LGBTQ, MENA, Muslim, Native American and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander) are reported in separate documents.
