

SURVEY INSTRUMENT NOTES

- This is a survey instrument, documenting the survey design and variable construction.
- This is not a codebook that directly corresponds with the dataset. The codebook is a separate file, which you must consult for analysis.
- All questions constructed as "select all that apply" appear in the dataset as binary variables for each answer option.
- In the dataset, the "condition" variable series (near the end of the variable list) documents respondent Ns for all questions that are conditioned on split samples, demographic traits, or prior question responses. This is most commonly used for crosstabs against the original variable.
- Respondents do not see anything that appears in red text in this document. Red text is used in
 this document to flag conditions, programming notes, new variables generated from respondent
 answers, and other content not appearing in the user interface.
- Screen questions include only those necessary to provide a representative sample or meet a sample design requirement. They are used to assign respondents into quota buckets.
- Main sample race group segments are defined in the QRACEID variable, where all respondents
 are coded into one primary race/ethnic group: White, Latino, Black, AAPI, Native American, or
 MENA. QRACEID= S3 response if one option selected OR response to S4 primary race question.
- Binary race/ethnicity variables are broader, where respondents are can qualify into more than
 one group based on their response to S3. The binary variable is a count of all who checked the
 box for a given group, alone or in combination with other race/ethnic groups.
- Oversample segments:

Black immigrant: BlkIm= Any respondent who is foreign born and primary race is Black (S3=3 alone or S4=3 AND S25=2)

Afro-Latino: AfroLat= Any respondent who identifies or has Afro Latino relative (S6=2, 3, 4, 5)

LGBTQ= Any respondent who self-identifies as LGBTQ (S14=3 OR S15 =2, 3, or 4 OR S16=2, 3, or 4)

Native American: NatAm= Any respondent who self-identifies as Native American (S3=5), alone or in combination

MENA or Muslim: MENAMUS= Any respondent who self-identifies as MENA (S3=6) alone or in combination, or Muslim (S13=5) alone or in combination

Youth=Any respondent age 16 or 17 only

Jewish= Any respondent who self-identifies as Jewish (S13=4) or White (S3=1) alone or in combination
